

General Fund collections of \$6.25 billion in March were above the official monthly estimate by \$70.0 million. Year-to-Date (YTD) General Fund collections of \$33.22 billion are less than estimate by \$34.3 million. Total collections exceed those of the prior fiscal YTD by \$422.9 million, or 1.3%. As shown in the second graph on page 3, March typically reports the highest tax revenue collections, followed closely by April.

In March, two of the "Big 3" revenue sources exceeded estimate: Personal Income Taxes (\$1.64 billion) by \$45.0 million, and Corporate Taxes (\$3.05 billion) by \$77.2 million. Sales and Use Taxes (\$1.11 billion) missed the official estimate by \$36.5 million. Both the Personal Income Taxes and Sales and Use Taxes are showing yearly growth of 4.4% and 2.1%, respectively, whereas Corporate Taxes show -3.9% growth. It is important to note that Corporate Taxes lag behind the prior year's collections, in part, due to scheduled rate reductions to the Corporate Net Income Tax.

On the expenditure side, the Commonwealth has spent a total of \$35.42 billion out of the \$47.67 billion budget to date. After interest payments, the Rainy Day Fund currently has a balance of \$7.32 billion.


